
FIELD GRADE OFFICERS SURGEONS AND CHAPLAINS

Field Grade Officers were those who generally commanded units above the company level. In the Civil War, Field Grade Officers would command at the Regimental and Brigade level. Command of Divisions, Corps and Armies would be the responsibility of General Grade Officers.

The Mattoon Surgeons and Chaplains all entered army service from their private medical practices and their congregations, respectively.
